The group had a discussion about the surgery's boundaries and whether limiting the boundaries would benefit the surgery as there are a couple of patients attending the surgery who have other surgeries closer to them.

The stop smoking service is stopping and a new smoking service called SPOC is starting.

A new healthcare assistant apprentice has started called Molly and there is a new receptionist called Claire.

Also the do not attends are improving but the surgery still has a lot.

9. Update on CCG Hospital Review

Keith attended a meeting about the hospital review where there were doctors, nurses and patients present and all of their opinions were taken on board. A report is to be written. A guarantee that no hospital will close and no hospital will turn a patient away but may transfer a patient to a different hospital was made. Another proposal was that there would be one HR for all hospitals and for health carers to have a career 'passport'.

Each professional at the meeting took on people's opinions. One question asked was about the extra stress this was going to put onto the ambulance service and they said the trust may be able to fund 2 ambulances 24/7 for transfers.

Some of the main areas looked at by the trust are:

- Acute stroke
- Maternity
- A&E
- Childrens
- Endoscope

A common theme throughout these areas are a hopeful increase in consultants and in maternity looking to put a senior midwife on in place of a consultant but have a consultant on standby if needed.
